

So he said, "Lord, will you kill an innocent people? Did he not himself say to me, 'She is my sister'? And she herself said, 'He is my brother.' 

Genesis 21:29-31	References

Therefore that place was called Beersheba, because there both of them swore an oath.	<i>Beersheba</i> = well + seven; well + oath
