Maimonides' Eight Levels of Charity

- 1. Give unwillingly
- 2. Give willingly but inadequately
- 3. Give only after being asked
- 4. Giving before the request comes
- 5. Give when the donor and recipient know each other's identity
- 6. Give when the donor knows the recipient but the recipient does not know the donor
- 7. Give in secret so that neither party knows the other
- 8. Act so that the recipient will no longer require charity

- Share your "Lesson Reflections" responses with the group.
- Read **Matthew 6:1**.
 - Briefly revisit what it means to be "Salt" and "Light" as Jesus uses the terms in Mat. 5:13-16.
 - How can disciples reconcile Mat. 6:1 with Mat. 5:16, "Let your light shine before others so they may see your good works..."?
- Read Matthew 6:2-4.
 - O Why should we give?
 - How do some donors "sound a trumpet" today? Is publicizing a church's offering information "sounding a trumpet"? Why or why not?
 - Review the list on the front page of this handout. At which level is most of your giving? What steps can we take to incorporate some of the higher levels?
- Read Matthew 6:5-15.
 - O Why should we pray?
 - How would you summarize Jesus' message in verses 5-8?
 - o Read Psalm 22:1-2. Have you ever prayed in anger or disbelief? Describe.
 - What do you notice about the pronouns in verses 9-13? What does this teach us?
- Read **Matthew 6:16-18.** Share an experience you have had with fasting as a religious practice.
- Read Matthew 6:19-24 and Matthew 19:16-22.
 - o In what ways do the things/stuff of this world try to exert control over us?
 - o Practically speaking, what does it mean to store treasure in heaven?
 - Why does Jesus say the eye is the "lamp" rather than the "light"? What is the difference between the two?
- Read Matthew 6:25-34.
 - How do we work in the present and plan for the future without succumbing to worry and fear?
 - What is the relationship (if any) between material stuff and one's tendency to worry?
 - Is Jesus essentially teaching "don't worry; be happy?" Why or why not? If not, what is He teaching?
 - If you aren't a worrier, what practical advice can you share with those who may have a worrying mindset?
