

Matthew 9:20 And behold, a woman who had been suffering with bleeding twelve years approached from behind and touched the **edge (κράσπεδον)** of his cloak.

Numbers 15:37-40 The Lord also spoke to Moses, saying, “Speak to the sons of Israel and tell them that they shall make for themselves **tassels (תִּצִיִּת - κράσπεδον (LXX))** on the **corners (קַנְפֵי)** of their garments throughout their generations and that they shall put on the tassel of each corner a violet thread. It shall be a tassel for you to look at and **remember all the commandments of the Lord so that you will do them and not follow your own heart and your own eyes, which led you to prostitute yourselves** so that you will remember and do all My commandments and be holy to your God.



Fringes - (tzitzit תִּצִיִּת / *kraspedon* κράσπεδον) attached to the corner (*canaf* קַנְפֵי - “wing”) of a garment.

- Share any “Lesson Reflections” with the group. Recite this lesson’s memory verse and discuss what it means to you.
- **Jairus’ Request: Mark 5:21-24**
 - Jairus was the “CEO” of the Capernaum synagogue. How do you think it felt for Jairus to approach Jesus humbly?
 - What do we learn about faith from this story? How does your faith compare to Jairus’?
- **The Woman with a hemorrhage: Mark 5:25-34**
 - Is Jesus the first person you turn to when you have a dilemma, or do you seek worldly wisdom first? How do we strike a balance between the practical and the spiritual?
 - Conversely, some Christians believe if someone has an unresolved ailment, it is because he or she “doesn’t have enough faith.” How would you respond to such a statement?
 - For whose benefit does Jesus ask, “Who touched me?” Explain.
 - Why does Jesus insist that the woman identify herself?
 - Jairus is still there waiting. What do you think was going through his mind as the scene with the woman plays out?
 - Read **Numbers 15:37-40** on the reverse side. What things can we do today to tangibly remind us of Jesus’ commands and help prevent us from straying off course?
- **Raising of Jairus’ Daughter: Mark 5:35-43**
 - Describe God’s timing versus our expectations.
 - What did Jesus mean by saying, “The child is not dead but only sleeping”?
 - Why does He command the miracle be kept quiet when He told the man in Gadara to tell everyone?
 - What aspects are similar about the faiths of Jairus and the woman? On what points do their faiths differ?
 - Why is our faith such a big deal to God? How do we become people of great faith, fearless and confident?
 - Why do you think this miracle caused them to only “be amazed,” whereas Jesus’ calming the storm caused them to fear?
